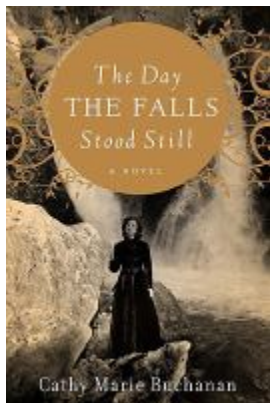

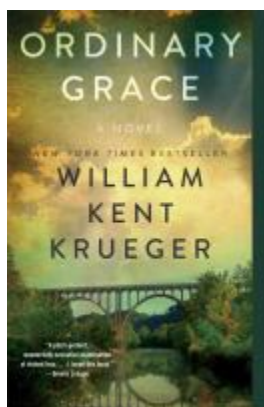
[The Day the Falls Stood Still: A Novel](#) by Cathy Marie Buchanan

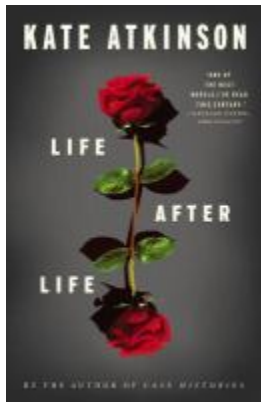
[Cinnamon and Gunpowder: A Novel](#) by Eli Brown

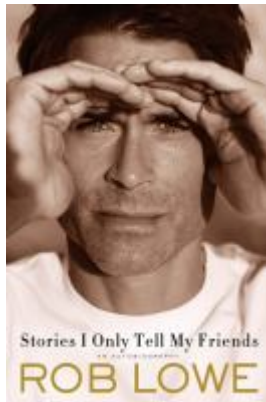
[Truth & Beauty: A Friendship](#) by Ann Patchett

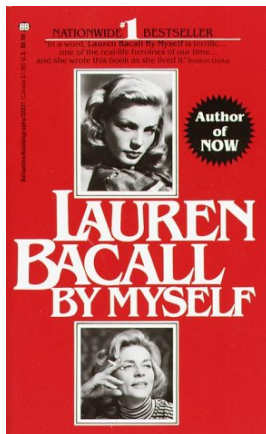

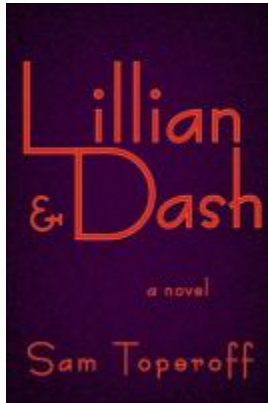

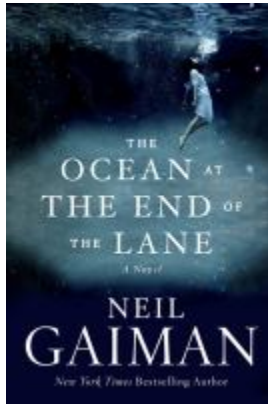
